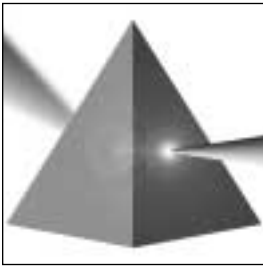

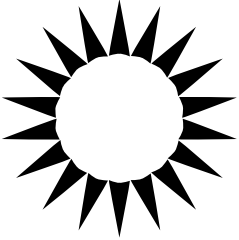
After conducting a thorough search, the *Pride Center* is proud to announce the hiring of attorney Ellen J. Gilio as Executive Director.

## Hiring of Executive Director

Ellen Gilio will be the organization's first executive director and will be responsible, in partnership with the Board of Directors, for all business, financial and operational goals of the *Pride Center*. The *Pride Center of New Jersey* was founded in 1994 and is currently the state's only community center serving the lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender community. The Center serves as a meeting space for twenty different organizations, provides a statewide GLBT Info-Line, free HIV Counseling and Testing in conjunction with Robert Wood Johnson University Hospital as well as many important educational and social programs.

Ellen Gilio, an Essex County resident, born in Newark, New Jersey, earned a Bachelor's of Science degree in Business Administration with a major in Finance at Villanova University and a Juris Doctor from Rutgers University, Newark, New Jersey.

With a previous background in general practice law and banking, Ellen Gilio has additionally served many years as a volunteer in the LGBT community. Her community advocacy includes serving as Representative

to the United Nations Department of Public Information on behalf of the International Lesbian & Gay Association (ILGA), Coordinator of the United Nations Project of the Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual and Transgender Community Services Center of New York City, Volunteer Coordinator for the ILGA Annual Conference in New York, an Assistant Venue Manager at the Gay Games in New York and a volunteer for Project Angel Food and Devine Design in California.

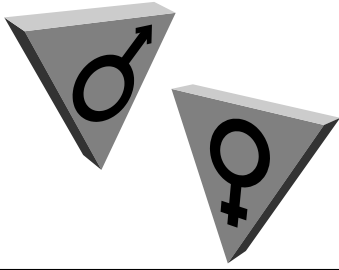

## New Jersey's Statewide Pride

Bigger and Better than ever! The weather was PERFECT. Ominous clouds in the morning blew through, and sprinkled for a second, but then the sun came out, a healthy breeze persisted, and a temperate sunshine prevailed all day—the Perfect Day. June 2, 2002: NJ's Annual Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual, Transgendered and Intersexed Pride Celebration. It was by leaps and bounds NJ's biggest pride event ever. More than 40 groups, led by three dozen rainbow draped motorcycles, proudly paraded through Asbury Park and into the festival grounds where vendors and 12,000 attendees completely filled both Bradley and adjoining Atlantic Parks. Attractions included a marketplace of 140 vendors, one of NJ's largest outdoor displays of The Names Project AIDS Memorial Quilt, and two rides for the younger revelers: a moon bounce and an oversized slide. # Guest Editorial

This is an exciting time for LGBT families and their struggle for legal rights and equality. The Netherlands recently became the first country in the world to allow lesbian and gay couples to marry. More than a thousand couples have entered into civil unions in Vermont, winning all the rights of married couples under Vermont law. This year, California enacted an unprecedented domestic partnership law for residents of that state. Hawaii continues to offer substantial legal rights to lesbian and gay couples under its “reciprocal beneficiaries” law. And there is a serious push for civil unions or marriage for same sex couples in the Connecticut legislature.

It’s also an important time for same sex couples in New Jersey. Community activists have worked hard and built strong support in the New Jersey legislature for a domestic partnership bill that is currently under consideration. And activists have worked closely with Lambda Legal during the past year to reach out to a broad array of New Jersey leaders and educate them about the importance of winning the freedom to marry for our community. We have received an especially warm response from people of faith and clergy, culminating in the recent formation of a clergy coalition that is committed to helping lead the fight for marriage equality.

Demanding full equality inevitably means fighting for the right to marry. If straight couples have the right to marry and all the benefits, responsibilities and societal support and recognition that go along with it, why shouldn’t we? So we fight for full equality and marriage because it’s the right thing to do. But we also know it gets results, even if it doesn’t always lead immediately to marriage. For example, in Vermont it was a lawsuit demanding full marriage rights that resulted in that state’s path-breaking civil union law. In Hawaii it was Lambda Legal’s marriage lawsuit that led to the “reciprocal beneficiaries” law. In other states, we have won domestic partnership rights from politicians who weren’t willing to meet our demand for marriage, but who nonetheless recognized that our relationships deserve legal protection (or didn’t want to appear anti-gay).

So we fight for marriage because we need it, we deserve it, and it gets results. It’s true that some of us

wouldn’t choose marriage even if we could, just like some straight people don’t choose to marry. But that should be our choice, not the government’s. When the government lets everybody else decide for themselves whether to get married, but tells us we have no choice, that’s called second-class citizenship. We don’t pay second-class taxes, and we don’t deserve second-class citizenship. It’s worth remembering that the benefits and protections that come along with marriage are especially important for the most vulnerable members of our community—the poor. Those of us with more resources can compensate to some extent for not being able to marry by hiring lawyers to draft wills and other legal papers, buying insurance policies together, and doing all the other things that money can buy. But low income people desperately need the safety net that comes along with being able to get on a working spouse’s health insurance plan, having access to Social Security and Worker’s Compensation benefits for spouses, automatically inheriting a spouse’s property and belongings in the event of an unexpected death, and so much more.

When we fight for marriage and full equality for our community, it puts the lie to the radical right’s attempt to call themselves “pro-family.” We’re the real “pro-family” movement because we want protection and security for all families. When we fight for our families and show the world who we are, we win greater respect and lead the way to full equality. The State of New Jersey, by awarding same-sex couples the right to adopt jointly, recognized that love—not sexual orientation—makes a family. To win our families full recognition of all the rights and protections offered by the state to married couples—not just joint adoption—Lambda Legal filed a marriage case in June on behalf of seven couples. These couples sought marriage licenses from the state to better protect their families, but were denied not only protections and security, but also their full citizenship. Remembering that the successes of Vermont and Hawaii came through a combination of public education, litigation, and legislative work, we will keep working together—continuing to teach the lesson that love makes a family until we win the right to marry, and every other right that comes with full equality.
